This is really not a book, but a collection of short ghost stories (I think there are eight). The basic

mistake the author made was, ostensibly, to let the person who experienced the haunting tell the story (edited by the author, it is clear) -- but the storyteller is always nameless, as is the area, even the state, where it took place. "New England" is mentioned in the last story -- and that's as personal as it ever got. I know he meant to protect the personal details, but a clever author would have made use of pseudonyms and at least have given us a vague indication of where the haunting happened, without giving away private details. As it stands now the stories really left me cold. They're told in the first person, but that person never has a name. The area where it happened could be anywhere. So, there is nothing the reader can "grab at" to work up some empathy or sympathy for either protagonist or ghost! There's no real emotion in the stories, and mostly they end in mid-air: you find yourself asking, what next? The couple in the trailer home: did they leave it? What happened with the other houses -- did the families stay? (Only once do you read of a family getting ready to move out of a haunted house). Nope, this kind of emotionally detached style and unsatisfactory endings with no answers just did not do it for me

Not for the faint of heart. Very good stories sure to entertain you. Never a shortage for ghosts & hauntings.

I felt like I was sitting with a friend and hearing their stories. Gifted author and some of the stories gave me chills.
