

I love the candor of this author and the fact that although he thought he was doing what he believed the Lord was asking to do (praying for people to be healed) it didn't happen for a long time. I also love that he is just a working guy being who he is where he is and seeing God show up with acts of love and kindness. He has no title, no seminary degrees, no entourage, no publicity team and no offering envelopes to hand out. He's just like the rest of us. The folks whose stories are shared here are also just folks like the rest of us. But both the author and the people in this book have had encounters with the living God, and that's not theoretical love; that's a demonstration of love. The book is an easy read and feels like one could be sitting at the coffee shop with a friend, just listening to stories -- and getting inspired and built up in faith by examples of the goodness of God.

I hadn't finished the third chapter before I needed to get up and run around the house a few times. This book had so revved me up that I had to run, I had to shout, I had to do SOMETHING!! I'm a great fan of testimonies ("This is what God did!"), and this book is thick with excellent testimonies. But they're not just naked testimonies: they're wrapped in the lives of real people, real situations, who learn real lessons along the way, and that helps me learn from them!

The Praying Medic shares his real life experiences about God's healing with us. Not about church, not about religion, this is a multiple experience testimony about God's love and provision out in the everyday world, where Jesus shows up right where someone is at the time.

I read this right on the heels of his last book and it does not disappoint. I had a hard time putting it down. Full of anecdotes, there is less formal "teaching" than the first book yet there are many good truth nuggets to pick up and remember. Most importantly, it has encouraged me and increased my faith to see people healed when I pray with them. I have already tried his "techniques" and have seen the fruit! And I prayed just now that God would send more people my way so I could pray too!

This book continues on where this author's last one left off - but it is still sufficiently substantial to be a stand-alone-great-book. The stories keep coming - one after another - each one greater and more beautiful. The author truly tells enough of his insight and techniques to get anybody started in healing strangers and friends.

Enjoyed reading the entire book this evening, found it to be encouraging with faith building stories of Divine Healing. My desire is to become like PM and walk with the Holy Spirit and heal all those wanting it.
